

## ABOUT THE PROGRAM

The Regional Computer Forensics Laboratory (RCFL) Program is a national network of FBI-sponsored, full service digital forensics laboratories. An RCFL is devoted entirely to the examination of digital evidence in support of criminal investigations such as, but not limited to—

- Terrorism
- Child Pornography
- Crimes of Violence
- Theft or Destruction of Intellectual Property
- Internet Crimes
- Fraud
- Murder.

The program's 16 RCFLs are available to more than 5,000 law enforcement agencies in 17 states.



## THE INTERMOUNTAIN WEST (IW) RCFL

### Service Area

Any law enforcement agency with jurisdiction in the states of Utah, Idaho, and Montana is eligible to receive the IWRCFL's assistance. Each request is evaluated individually and prioritized by the nature of the crime.

### Types of Assistance

The IWRCFL's services include—

- Pre-seizure consultation
- On-site seizure collection
- Impartial examinations of digital evidence
- Duplication of digital evidence
- Courtroom testimony.

### Training

The IWRCFL offers training workshops for law enforcement personnel on the collection and preservation of digital evidence. The training schedule is available on our Web site, where perspective students can also register for a course.

## JOIN THE IWRCFL

The IWRCFL is controlled, operated, and directed by an Executive Board, and is composed of the heads of all Participating Agencies. Benefits of participation are numerous and include—

- Approximately 12-18 months of first-class technical training for your staff
- A suite of forensics equipment and software for each Examiner
- Direct peer review and coaching from certified Examiners
- The opportunity to work on a variety of investigations—RCFL Examiners hold "Top Secret" security clearances, so they can support matters involving national security
- FBI certification as a computer forensics Examiner.

As Examiners bring their knowledge and experience back to their home agencies and new recruits replace them, law enforcement's ability to address crimes involving a computer or any other electronic device is significantly enhanced.
